The Cabarrus County Education Foundation is pleased to be able to offer this special scholarship opportunity for this year. It is made possible by a generous donation from Ellis Jewelers. We will be awarding five - \$100 scholarships to students to attend a state-wide CTE related competition.

SCHOLARSHIP PURPOSE: To expand opportunities for high school students to participate in state-wide career and technical education competitions

SCHOLARSHIP ELIGIBILITY: The scholarship is available to all high school students in Cabarrus County Schools who actively participate in one of the following student organizations and are in good standing at their school:

DECA, FBLA, FCCLA, FFA, HOSA, SKILLS USA, Technology Student Association (TSA)

SCHOLARSHIP FUNDS: Funds may be used for registration fees or hotel costs related directly to attending the competition. Any unused funds must be returned to the Cabarrus County Education Foundation no later than June 30, 2019 by the school.

SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS:

1. All funds must be used no later than June 30, 2019.
2. A one-page final report (to be provided) must be submitted to CCEF no later than July 1, 2019.
3. Attend the CCS Board of Education Meeting to be recognized for your scholarship on May 13, 2019 at 6:00pm at the CCS Education Center.
4. Attend the CTE Awards Night on May 16, 2019 at 6pm. Location to be determined later.

SCHOLARSHIP PROCEDURES:

1. Submit complete scholarship application form with required signatures to your club advisor. Incomplete applications will not be accepted.
2. Ask your club advisor to add a recommendation to your application and submit directly to CCEF. No applications will be accepted directly from students.
3. All applications must be received into the Cabarrus County Education Foundation office no later than 5pm on January 25, 2019.

SCHOLARSHIP EVALUATION: Scholarship application will be reviewed by a selection committee which may be comprised of CCS Curriculum & Instruction staff, Education Foundation board members and community members. Selection will be based on the overall impact participating in the competition will have on the student.
